# Native Prairie Reconstruction for Pollinator Habitat in the Midsouth

This presentation will cover what native plants are, why they are important, when and how to establish them for the best chance of success. The focus will be on site preparation and establishment using different techniques of installation for both large-scale and small-scale plantings. Natives are not hard to establish, they are just different.

Robert has a B.S. degree in Natural Resource Management from University of Tennessee Martin and a M.S. in Wildlife Ecology and Conservation from the University of Florida. Robert began his career working at the Tall Timbers Research Station in South Georgia and North Florida, studying northern bobwhites. He has worked as a Wildlife Biologist for Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources, working with private landowners to establish wildlife habitat through Farm Bill programs.
